

DEVELOPER shall, concurrent with requesting any necessary written assurance from DISTRICT, request in writing that the County of Riverside include in its approval of DEVELOPER'S tentative map a condition that DEVELOPER, his successors or assigns, provide evidence of compliance with the terms of this Agreement prior to issuance of any building permit by the County of Riverside, or its successor, for lots in the approved tract.
- C. DEVELOPER shall notify any successors or assigns that this Agreement has been executed and is in effect. In addition, in the event this property is annexed into a city within our jurisdiction, Desert Recreation District will continue to receive the same amount as the Quimby fees identified in this Agreement, which fees shall mitigate the continuing impacts of such growth.

II. RESPONSIBILITIES OF DISTRICT

- A. Monies paid to **DISTRICT** under this Agreement will be deposited by **DISTRICT** in a separate account for such type of fees. Disbursements from that account shall be solely for the procurement of public park facilities determined by **DISTRICT** to benefit residents of Tentative Tract Map No. ______.
- B. The fees specified herein were calculated and are levied in accordance with and shall be collected, administered and disbursed in accordance with Coachella Valley Recreation & Park District Master Plan, Section 10.35 of Riverside County Ordinance No. 460, Government Code Section 66477, and any and all other applicable laws, rules and regulations as they now exist and as they may from time to time be amended.

III. MISCELLANEOUS

A. It is expressly understood and agreed by the **DEVELOPER** and **DISTRICT** that the law of the State of California shall govern them and the interpretation of the Agreement and

that any litigation brought because of, or involving this Agreement shall be initiated exclusively in the Superior Court, Riverside County, Indio Division.

- B. In the event of litigation to enforce this Agreement, the prevailing party in such litigation shall be entitled to reasonable costs and attorneys fees.
- C. In the event that **DEVELOPER'S** tentative subdivision map expires without extension or approval by the County of Riverside, all obligations of **DEVELOPER** and **DISTRICT** herein shall cease.
- D. All terms, conditions, and provisions hereof shall inure to and shall bind the parties hereto, their respective successors-in-interest and assigns.
- E. No waiver of any term or condition of this Agreement shall be a continuing waiver thereof.
- F. This Agreement shall be amended only in writing signed by both parties.
- G. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement of the parties and supersedes all other agreements, whether written or oral.

Notice of Preparation of a CEQA Document for the Vista Del Agua Specific Plan

The South Coast Air Quality Management District (SCAQMD) staff appreciates the opportunity to comment on the above-mentioned document. The SCAQMD staff's comments are recommendations regarding the analysis of potential air quality impacts from the proposed project that should be included in the draft CEQA document. Please send the SCAQMD a copy of the CEQA document upon its completion. Note that copies of the Draft EIR that are submitted to the State Clearinghouse are not forwarded to the SCAQMD. Please forward a copy of the Draft EIR directly to SCAQMD at the address in our letterhead. In addition, please send with the draft EIR all appendices or technical documents related to the air quality and greenhouse gas analyses and electronic versions of all air quality modeling and health risk assessment files. These include original emission calculation spreadsheets and modeling files (not Adobe PDF files). Without all files and supporting air quality documentation, the SCAQMD will be unable to complete its review of the air quality analysis in a timely manner. Any delays in providing all supporting air quality documentation will require additional time for review beyond the end of the comment period.

Air Quality Analysis

The SCAQMD adopted its California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) Air Quality Handbook in 1993 to assist other public agencies with the preparation of air quality analyses. The SCAQMD recommends that the Lead Agency use this Handbook as guidance when preparing its air quality analysis. Copies of the Handbook are available from the SCAQMD's Subscription Services Department by calling (909) 396-3720. More recent guidance developed since this Handbook was published is also available on SCAQMD's website here: http://www.aqmd.gov/home/regulations/ceqa/air-quality-analysis-handbook/ceqa-air-quality-handbook-(1993). SCAQMD staff also recommends that the lead agency use the CalEEMod land use emissions software. This software has recently been updated to incorporate up-to-date state and locally approved emission factors and methodologies for estimating pollutant emissions from typical land use development. CalEEMod is the only software model maintained by the California Air Pollution Control Officers Association (CAPCOA) and replaces the now outdated URBEMIS. This model is available free of charge at: www.caleemod.com.

The Lead Agency should identify any potential adverse air quality impacts that could occur from all phases of the project and all air pollutant sources related to the project. Air quality impacts from both construction (including demolition, if any) and operations should be calculated. Construction-related air quality impacts typically include, but are not limited to, emissions from the use of heavy-duty equipment from grading, earth-loading/unloading, paving, architectural coatings, off-road mobile sources (e.g., heavy-duty construction equipment) and on-road mobile sources (e.g., construction worker vehicle trips, material transport trips). Operation-related air quality impacts may include, but are not limited to, emissions from stationary sources (e.g., boilers), area sources (e.g., solvents and coatings), and vehicular trips (e.g., on- and off-road tailpipe emissions and entrained dust). Air quality impacts from indirect sources, that is, sources that generate or attract vehicular trips should be included in the analysis.

The SCAQMD has also developed both regional and localized significance thresholds. The SCAQMD staff requests that the lead agency quantify criteria pollutant emissions and compare the results to the recommended regional significance thresholds found here: http://www.aqmd.gov/docs/default-source/ceqa/handbook/scaqmd-air-quality-significance-thresholds.pdf?sfvrsn=2. In addition to analyzing regional air quality impacts, the SCAQMD staff recommends calculating localized air quality impacts and comparing the results to localized significance thresholds (LSTs). LST's can be used in addition to the recommended regional significance thresholds as a second indication of air quality impacts when preparing a CEQA document. Therefore, when preparing the air quality analysis for the proposed project, it is

recommended that the lead agency perform a localized analysis by either using the LSTs developed by the SCAQMD or performing dispersion modeling as necessary. Guidance for performing a localized air quality analysis can be found at: http://www.aqmd.gov/home/regulations/ceqa/air-quality-analysis-handbook/localized-significance-thresholds.

In the event that the proposed project generates or attracts vehicular trips, especially heavy-duty diesel-fueled vehicles, it is recommended that the lead agency perform a mobile source health risk assessment. Guidance for performing a mobile source health risk assessment ("Health Risk Assessment Guidance for Analyzing Cancer Risk from Mobile Source Diesel Idling Emissions for CEQA Air Quality Analysis") can be found at: http://www.aqmd.gov/home/regulations/ceqa/air-quality-analysis-handbook/mobile-source-toxics-analysis. An analysis of all toxic air contaminant impacts due to the use of equipment potentially generating such air pollutants should also be included.

In addition, guidance on siting incompatible land uses (such as placing homes near freeways) can be found in the California Air Resources Board's *Air Quality and Land Use Handbook: A Community Perspective*, which can be found at the following internet address: http://www.arb.ca.gov/ch/handbook.pdf. CARB's Land Use Handbook is a general reference guide for evaluating and reducing air pollution impacts associated with new projects that go through the land use decision-making process.

Mitigation Measures

In the event that the project generates significant adverse air quality impacts, CEQA requires that all feasible mitigation measures that go beyond what is required by law be utilized during project construction and operation to minimize or eliminate these impacts. Pursuant to state CEQA Guidelines §15126.4 (a)(1)(D), any impacts resulting from mitigation measures must also be discussed. Several resources are available to assist the Lead Agency with identifying possible mitigation measures for the project, including:

The California Department of Fish and Wildlife (Department) appreciates the opportunity to comment on the Notice of Preparation for the Notice of Preparation for the Vista Del Agua Specific Plan (SCH# 2015031003).

CVP Palm Springs, LLC, in affiliation with Strategic Land Partners, LLC is proposing to implement a residential, commercial, and open space development, with associated on-site and off-site infrastructure improvements for the Vista Del Agua Specific Plan (Project), an approximate 275.38-acre site located within the City of Coachella, in Riverside County. As presently proposed, the Project proponent is preparing a draft specific plan (Vista Del Agua Specific Plan No. 14-01) that would allow conversion of this property to a mixed-use development with residential, commercial, park, and open space uses. To accomplish this, the Project proponent will submit applications seeking approval from the City of Coachella for a general plan amendment, a change of zone, a specific plan, a tentative parcel map for the individual planning areas, a community facilities district to fund the required on-site and off-site infrastructure improvements (water, sewer, roadways, etc.) for the Project area, and a development agreement.

The proposed Project site is currently undeveloped, with numerous unimproved dirt access roads used primarily for agricultural activities in the area. Adjacent land uses consist of cropland and sparse, rural residential development to the south, east, and west, with I-10 at the Project's northernmost boundaries. The Mecca Hills are located 4-5 miles to the southeast. The Indio Hills are located 2-3 miles north of the Project site. The Coachella Canal is located directly adjacent to the northeast corner of the property.

Coachella Valley Multi-species Habitat Conservation Plan

The project site lies within the Coachella Valley Multi-Species Habitat Conservation Plan (CVMSHCP). The CVMSHCP identifies conservation areas and potential habitat for a wide range of plant and animal species that occur on or in the vicinity of the proposed project site. The project site may lie within a conservation area under the CVMSHCP. The CVMSHCP allows a take authorization to a wide host of covered species listed in the plan. The proximity of the CVMSHCP Conservation Area to the proposed project is unknown at this time, however it may require that development

plans incorporate the CVMSHCP Land Use Adjacency Guidelines to avoid or minimize potential "edge effects."

Western Burrowing Owls

The proposed Project site is located in potential habitat for the Western Burrowing Owl (*Athene cunicularia*). This species is designated a California Species of Special Concern. Section 15380 of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) requires the lead agency to treat sensitive species as though they were listed, if the species meets the criteria for listing described in the section. The Department believes that the proposed project could further the decline of the above sensitive species. This species must be treated as though it were listed and appropriate avoidance, mitigation, and compensation for impacts need to be identified. Unavoidable impacts to the Western Burrowing Owl should be mitigated through acquisition and protection, in perpetuity, of high quality biological habitat. In addition, surveys and mitigation should be consistent with the 2012 Department Staff Report on Burrowing Owl Mitigation (link: http://www.dfg.ca.gov/wildlife/nongame/docs/BUOWStaffReport.pdf).

Streambed Alteration Agreement

The CEQA document on p.39 states: "This wash was determined to be non-jurisdictional because it does not have an OHWM, does not have a defined bed, bank, or channel, and because it is not a relatively permanent water (RPW) feature, defined as a feature typically flowing year round or having continuous flow at least seasonally, which is typically three months. As a desert wash, it receives infrequent short duration surface flows from large storm events. Thus there will be no project related effects to potential jurisdictional waters. During high perception storm events, the unnamed wash acts as a route from the San Gorgonio Mountains to the San Gorgonio River."

The Department has direct authority under Fish and Game code §1600 et seq. in regard to any proposed activity which would divert, obstruct, or affect the natural flow or change the bed, channel, or bank of any river, stream, or lake.

The Department is emphasizing in comment letters on projects with impacts to lakes or streambeds, that alternatives and mitigation measures must be addressed in CEQA certified documents prior to submittal of an application of a Streambed Alteration Agreement (SAA). Any information which is supplied to the Department after the CEQA process is complete will not have been subject to the public review requirements of CEQA.

In order for the Department to process a SAA agreement, the CEQA-certified documents must include an analysis of the impacts of the proposed project on the lake or streambed, an analysis of the biological resources present on the site, copies of biological studies conducted on the site, biological survey methodology, and a discussion of any alternative, avoidance, or mitigation measures which will reduce the impacts of the proposed development to a level of insignificance. In addition, a

discussion of potential adverse impacts from any increased runoff, sedimentation, soil erosion, and/or pollutants on streams and watercourses on or near the project site, with mitigation measures proposed to alleviate such impacts must be included in the CEQA - certified documents.

The Department believes that more information is needed to understand the distinction between temporary and permanent impacts of the project. This should include acreage of the areas impacted.

Thank you for the opportunity to express the position of the Coachella Valley Mosquito and Vector Control District (hereafter, the District) regarding the Notice of Preparation of a Draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR) for the Vista Del Agua Specific Plan.

The District is a non-enterprise independent special district accountable to the citizens of the Coachella Valley, charged with the protection of public health through the control of vectors and vector-borne diseases within its boundaries. We operate under the California Health and Safety Code Division 3, Sections 2000-2910 (known as the Mosquito Abatement and Vector Control District Law). Our activities include the prevention and control of mosquitoes, filth flies, eye gnats, and the red imported fire ant.

The project will result in an increase in storm water retention sites, which could provide additional habitat for larval mosquitoes. The location of the site is surrounded on three sides by agricultural areas, and this may result in an increased need for fly control. The irrigation of the property could increase the suitability of the land for red imported fire ants. The development of the property could result in an increase of the vector populations, and with the increase of the population of humans in the Coachella Valley, we anticipate that more people may be at risk of contracting vector-borne diseases.

There are a number of construction practices and landscaping designs that will reduce and potentially prevent the production of mosquitoes and red imported fire ants in the area. We look forward to working with you and Matthew Fagan Consulting Services to reduce these risks by advising on prevention strategies.

This letter supersedes our letter dated October 12, 2010, copy enclosed.

This area is designated Zone X on Federal Flood Insurance rate maps, which are in effect at this time by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

Plans for stormwater facilities shall be submitted to the Coachella Valley Water District (CVWD) for review.

There are existing United States Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) facilities not shown on the development plans. There may be conflicts with these facilities. We request the City of Coachella (City) to withhold issuance of grading permits until CVWD has reviewed the proposed development and related impacts to the USBR facilities and associated right-of-way and provided City with written confirmation that there is no interference. The USBR conflicts include but are not limited to Lateral 105.7, 105.7-0.2, Lateral 105.7-0.4 and Lateral 106.3.

This area is underlain with agricultural drainage lines. There are Private facilities not shown on the development plans. There may be conflicts with these facilities. We request City to withhold issuance of grading permits until CVWD has reviewed the proposed development and related impacts to the Private facilities and associated right-of-way and provide City with written confirmation that there is no interference. The Private conflicts include but are not limited to Tile drain Nos. 541 and 71.

Surface and subsurface drainage facilities in the vicinity of this project were designed and constructed for agricultural drainage. At the City's request, CVWD would consider use of these drainage facilities for urban drainage if (1) the surface and subsurface drainage facilities can



physically handle the new urban drainage, (2) the area is incorporated into the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit and Waste Discharge Requirements for the discharge of stormwater in the Whitewater River Watershed, which is known as the MS4 Permit and (3) the project is annexed into a future district(s) for recovery of capital and operation/maintenance costs associated with the new urban drainage system.

If CVWD drainage facilities are utilized for urban drainage, CVWD would need replacement or additional drainage facilities to provide for the orderly expansion of the drainage system. These facilities may include pipelines, channels, pump stations and other facilities. The developer may be required to install these facilities and provide land and/or easements on which some of these facilities will be located. These sites shall be shown on the tract map as lots and/or easements to be deeded to CVWD for such purpose.

This development lies within the study area of the 2010 Water Management Plan Update. The groundwater basin in the Coachella Valley is in a state of overdraft. Each new development contributes incrementally to the overdraft. CVWD has a Water Management Plan in place to reduce the overdraft to the groundwater basin. The elements of the Water Management Plan include supplemental imported water, source substitution and water conservation. The plan lists specific actions for reducing overdraft. The elements and actions described in the plan shall be incorporated into the design of this development to reduce its negative impact on the Coachella Valley groundwater basin.

This development lies within the City of Coachella's water service area boundary. The District and the City have signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) to work together to ensure sufficient water supplies for new development. The MOU outlines ways that the City will participate in funding CVWD's acquisition of supplemental water supplies sufficient to offset the impacts of new water demands resulting from development within the City. The amount paid for supplemental water supplies shall not exceed CVWD's Supplemental Water Supply Charge for similar development types and water requirements in effect at the time paid.

The MOU also ensures that the two agencies coordinate on the review and approval of a Water Supply Assessment (WSA) for this development. The City is responsible for preparing and approving the WSA and shall submit the draft WSA to CVWD for review prior to approval. CVWD's review will ensure that the WSA incorporates the goals and objectives of the 2010 Coachella Valley Water Management Plan Update.
